

Brewer scores career high in win

Minnesota Timberwolves small forward Corey Brewer scored a career high 27 points in the Timberwolves 101-89 win over the Washington Wizards.

It marked for the first time all season that the Timberwolves have won back-to-back games.

Brewer finished the game nine of 16 from the field and converting eight of nine from the free throw line. He also finished with seven rebounds.

Minnesota improves to 7-24 for the season and will play the San Antonio Spurs Tuesday night on the road.
